Learning Conference Revisited! Royalties Debate Breaks Out At Conclave (By Mike Boyle for *R&R*, 6/27) On the surface, it had all the potential of being a meeting of the feuding Hatfield and McCoy clans. However, Friday afternoon's (June 27) "Royalties - What You Need To Know" session at the Conclave Learning Conference, featuring both sides of the royalties issue — which if it successfully wins congressional approval one day would force terrestrial broadcasters to pay fees to performers and recording artists for work that is broadcast over the airwaves — was, to the credit of moderator Reed Bunzel, president and CEO of American Media Services, a civil dialogue, albeit filled with back and forth jabs. And while no official "winner" to the spirited debate was crowned, the broadcaster-filled audience was clearly behind NAB president and CEO David Rehr and NAB Radio board vice chairman and CEO of Commonwealth Broadcasting Corp. Steve Newberry, who both oppose what the NAB continues to call a "tax" against the broadcasters. On the other side of the debate were Darryl Friedman VP of advocacy and government for The Recording Academy and Michael Huppe, general council for the independent, nonprofit performance rights organization Sound Exchange, who called the royalties debate a "simple issue about

basic, fundamental fairness." He added, "The radio business makes \$16 billion a year off the backs of performers and those that invest in them, and those performers don't see a penny of those revenues. The legislation we're talking about is an attempt to just have radio pay a fair compensation to those artists and performers for what they give to radio." Quick to counter Huppe, Newberry said, "We recognize the value of the music we play. No one has ever said there is no value in the music we play. But what is being said is there is no value to what we have given these artists over these years." He added, even if it's a \$500 fee, there is a principle issue here that we've done this for decades and when their [the labels] business model has changed, all of a sudden we're the greedy bastards that are stealing the money. I do have some indignation about that. And of all of the money we generate for the broadcast industry, not all of it is because of the music." Rehr, who quipped that he was sitting "strapped into his chair" waiting to make his points, said, "It is factually correct that Congress has considered this [royalty fees] before and rejected it. And while the record labels and some artists, not all artists, are not disregarding the fact that a majority of the Congress is already on record opposing fees on radio for playing music, it will be the new artists that will be punished if this performance tax is approved. And by the way, it is a tax because they are going to take money from you [the broadcasters] and give it to someone else, and the government is sanctioning it." Huppe took issue with Rehr's constant reference to the proposed fees as "taxes," saying, "This is a royalty to performers for a product that forms the core basis of what radio sells and it's no different than paying royalties to the songwriters through ASCAP and BMI." In his keynote address to Conclave attendees earlier in the day, Rehr said the NAB looked at the issue of promotion and they

have quantified it. "We estimate that between \$1.4 and \$2.4 billion a year in promotion [radio airplay] goes to artists and labels, and that doesn't include all of the concert promotion, of which artists and record labels make a substantial amount of money." While the volleying continued back and forth for another 40-plus minutes, R&R executive editor Paul Heine started the Q&A portion of the session asking if there was any room for negotiation between the two sides on the issue of royalty fees. Rehr relayed the story of a congressman who is a proponent of the fees recently telling him he should negotiate, to which Rehr told the congressman, "I'd rather cut my throat than negotiate on this. And that's the opinion that we have at the NAB." However, The Recording Academy's Friedman said his side was available Tuesday morning "to meet with you [the NAB] to make sure that we have a solution that is fair to everyone." Newberry answered, "I don't think I want to be there," and Rehr added, "I think I gave a speech against the performance tax this morning." For more, log onto <http://www.radioandrecords.com>.

Schultz Fires Up Conclave College Crowd (from *All Access*, 6/27) Syndicated progressive talker Ed Schultz delivered the afternoon keynote at the Conclave Learning Conference's Conclave College in Minneapolis Friday, doling out advice for aspiring radio professionals and managers alike, talking about his love of challenges and dealing with naysayers like the manager he said signed his release from a local Fargo contract to allow him to go into syndication and then crumpled it into a ball and threw it at Schultz, asserting, "You'll never make it." In a speech that often took the form of a coach's pep talk, Schultz exhorted managers to encourage risk-taking and new ideas. "You want dreamers," said Schultz, whose show is distributed by Dial Global (formerly Jones Radio Networks). "You want believers. You want passion." Schultz, who told the audience that he taped a television pilot sitting in the late Tim Russert's chair in Washington on Thursday, joked, "How come this didn't happen to me when I was 40?" but answered, "I wasn't ready." The House pushback from the Democratic side of the aisle continues as the **FCC** contemplates a proposal to approve the XM-Sirius merger with conditions volunteered by the two companies. In a letter dated last Friday, five House Democrats from **Minnesota** shared their disapproval with the Commission, saying the current merger conditions would set aside only 8% of the combined company's spectrum — 4% for educational fare and another 4% to an outside entity, most likely a minority, to program their own channels on the service. The legislators said 25% of the spectrum should be reserved for educational, minority and emergency-service use. They called for a requirement that the satellite-radio receivers also be able to receive digital broadcasts from free, over-the-air radio stations. They also warned that approval of the XM-Sirius merger without conditions would be "to the detriment of the public interest," although the odds of an approval with no conditions are slim to none. Signing the letter were Reps. **Betty McCollum, James Oberstar, Collin Peterson, Keith Ellison** and **Tim Walz**.

Former **Saga Oldies** KIOA/Des Moines PM driver **Dic Youngs** is suing his former employers for age and disability discrimination. Youngs, who retired last September after 41 years with the station, filed court papers saying he was forced out due to his age and unnamed disability. KIOA GM **Bill Wells** says he is "stunned by this. He told me that he wanted to retire." Youngs still works for the Saga cluster as the Saturday night host at Adult Standards KRNT-AM.

Former **Wilks** Top 40 KMXV/Kansas City DJ **Gregory D. Sage** pleaded guilty Monday to receiving child porn through his computer. Sage also operated a business that sold photos of high school athletes from a website. Sage is looking at 15 years in federal prison.

Did we ever mention that former Main Streeter, Miles Riker, has been upped to Three Eagles Regional PD, overseeing station in Minnesota, Iowa, S. Dakota, Nebraska, Colorado and Puerto Rico? Okay, just kidding about the Puerto Rico part but the rest of it is true. One more thing, Miles is now OM of Mankato Three Eagles cluster, as well. Olé!
